## Grand Opening Set for Sun Meadows

The new Sun Meadows Raquet and Swim Club is hoping for sunshine and a crowd of guests Saturday, September 9., when the public is invited to come and see the facilities and watch some exhibition tennis matches at their Grand Opening.

The private club brings eight high quality tennis courts and a junior olympic size swimming pool into the Harker Heights area with the potential of becoming well known throughout the state. "The junior players will be the backbone of our plans," says Sun Meadows Pro Bill Payton. "We hope to build a junior team for competition around the state."

Saturday's exhibition will show some well known players here. World number one ranked Senior player, Russell Seymour, will be on hand to play singles tennis against Texas' number one ranked

Robert Trogolo. Both men are pros at Lakeway World of Tennis, Trogolo as assistant to Seymour.

The double's exhibition will include the two Lakeway pros, Sun Meadows' pro, Payton, and CTC's top ranked Jeff Player from South Africa. Partnerships for that game have not been decided yet.

Fred D. Boles of Harker Heights, co-owner of the club with Bruce Thompson of Temple, says, "It will be some of the best tennis people from this area will have the opportunity to see."

The Grand Opening will begin at noon with a ribbon cutting and introduction of the staff, many of whom are Harker Heights residents.

Two o'clock is the time set for the exhibition matches to be followed

at 5:00 p.m. with an Adult Mixed Doubles Round Robin and Junior competition.

An award ceremony and social hour will begin in the clubhouse at 7:00 p.m.

The clubhouse sits high on the hill off Old Nolan Road on the eastern limits of Harker Heights. Its patio offers a good vantage point for watching the courts.

Inside there is a snack bar, television lounge, pro shop, and dressing rooms. A men's night for Monday Night Football is one of the events planned or members, with some half-time tennis matches in addition.

The facilities are a welcome addition to Harker Heights, offering tennis and swimming programs for all ages of members and guests.
